


#### Singles

- Single frame photographs.
- Must have been taken in 2024.
- Eligible for the World Press Photo of the Year.



#### **Stories**

- 4-10 single frame photographs.
- Must have been taken in 2023 or 2024. At least 4 photographs in a story must have been taken in 2024.
- All 2024 photos are eligible for Photo of the Year.









#### **Long-Term Projects**

- 24-30 single frame photographs.
- Must contain photographs from at least 3 different years
- A minimum of 6 photographs must have been shot in 2024.
- All 2024 photos are eligible for Photo of the Year.

- Global jury

#### What does the Jury consider

- Visual quality
- Story
- Representation

#### What information is given to the jury

- Round 1: No photographer information given
- Round 2 onwards: Nationality, where photographer is based and for how long. Gender, short caption
- Round 3 onwards: Long caption
- Round 4 onwards: Motivation, type of project (assignment/personal project), funding

- Guarantee that your work will be seen by global professionals outside your network.
- Give your important work the chance to be seen by millions of people.

# How to prepare your entry



#### Some tips to prepare your entry

- 1. Make a good selection of your project(s) to enter.
- 2. Focus on edit and sequencing
- 3. It does not matter whether your photos have been published or not.
- 4. All photographs must have accurate captions and descriptions.
- 5. All captions must be in English, this can be done with Google Translate.
- 6. Entries can be submitted via Picter, our contest entry platform from 1 December 2024 10 January 2025. (If English is not your first language, open the tool in Google Chrome and translate in your browser)
- 7. Enter on time! The earlier the better.

#### Editing and sequencing tips

#### Keep in mind: What kind of story are you trying to tell?

This should guide you through the process of editing and sequencing your story

- Does the order of your photographs matter?
- Ensure the project has consistency in visual style
- Try to show different perspectives and compositions
- The story needs to be understood without reading the text
- Share it with people who are unfamiliar with the story and context
- Follow your gut!

## Add your motivation

#### How can you show your professional status?

Everyone who enters the contest for the first time needs to provide a document that proves their professional status. Here are some examples of documents we accept:

• valid press card, it should state that you are working as a photographer

OR

- at least 1 proof of publication from 2023 or 2024, with your name visible as credit, in either online or print format from a recognized media organization or publication
- OR
  - journalism union membership card

OR

- membership document from a recognized photographic association that shows the photographer is a professional member
- OR
  - a recent letter of reference (must be from 2023 or 2024) from a photo agency, photo editor, media organization or publication, stating you have worked for them as a photographer

#### Documents we do not accept as proof of professional status:


- Resumes, cover letters, diplomas or samples of photography
- If you are unsure about whether your documents qualify as proof, please email contest@worldpressphoto.org for advice.

#### Make sure to keep your original files!





If your work successfully reaches later rounds of the contest, you will be asked for original files of the images you submitted.

#### What counts as manipulation?

Photographs must comply with our rules on manipulation:

- Only single frame photographs will be accepted
- The content of a photograph must not be altered by adding, rearranging, reversing, distorting or removing people and/or objects from within the frame
- Adjustments of color or conversion to grayscale that do not alter content are permitted. But significant changes may count as manipulation.




